Vision and Mission-

Stop Genocide Now (SGN) is a grassroots community dedicated to working to protect populations in grave danger of violence, death, and displacement resulting from genocide. Through active education, advocacy and policy change SGN resolves to change the way the world responds to genocide. SGN is currently focused on creating awareness and action to stop the genocide in Darfur and deal appropriately with its aftermath. All of our projects focus on and utilize the strength and power in grassroots connectivity.



About i-ACT (interactive-activism)-

i-ACT continues to travel to the Chad/Darfur border and visit refugee camps. i-ACT uses the power of the Internet to put a face to the mind-numbing numbers of dead, dying and displaced.

Anybody, anywhere, with access to the Internet, is able to see and hear what clinging desperately to life in this harsh landscape must be like. Unlike news broadcasts or other print reports from the region, visitors to www.stopgenocidenow.org are able to track individual stories of families who've lost everything while fleeing their homes for fear of annihilation. Witness the utter failure of the international community to stop another genocide as more innocent civilians continue dying each month while waiting for assistance and security that is shamefully slow in coming.

By going to www.stopgenocidenow.org, visitors see the human face of this ongoing crisis, through daily video field-reports. Receive daily updates from the Chad/Darfur border about the security of the refugees and villagers. Get visuals of the conditions in the refugee camps and monitor the international aid reaching the victims. Make comments, ask questions, and post suggestions on the website's interactive blog-type feature. Watch interviews with frustrated officials on the ground from the African Union, Doctors Without Borders, the World Food Program, International Medical Corps, the UN High Commissioner for Refugees and other NGO's. And hear, first-hand, actual stories from the survivors themselves. i-ACT's citizen-journalists provide the on-the-ground reporting.

But perhaps most importantly, i-ACT connects the surviving victims of this genocide with the people that want to help, creating an interconnected community. Relationships between individuals, families, and communities will lead to deeper commitment and positive change in Darfur.

i-ACT also begins to look towards the future alongside those whose lives it will directly affect. i-ACT formulates and poses questions for the international community about the unimaginable task of reconciliation once security is restored and the search for justice and compensation by the more than 2 million survivors of this genocide, should they one day be able to return to their land. i-ACT is looking forward to assisting in the building of a stronger Darfur.



About Camp Darfur

An interactive awareness and education event that brings attention to the ongoing genocide in Darfur, Sudan, and gives individuals the opportunity to discover their own power to make a difference. A traveling refugee camp coming to your community.

Camp Darfur raises awareness and examines Sudan's Darfur region and its humanitarian

crisis – genocide. A deeply concerned world community must come together united as one voice to remember the victims of past genocides and to make a call to action to end the genocide in Darfur today.

The genocide in Darfur has taken the lives of an estimated 450,000 people, and more than 2.5 million are displaced and in grave danger of more violence and starvation. The international community has failed again to protect a population that has been targeted for genocide, and the responsibility falls on all of us to act and not remain silent.

Camp Darfur gives people across the country the opportunity to send a message of peace and solidarity to people of Darfur. "Never Again" has no meaning, if we do not stand up and create action, NOW!

He believes in the power of community and compassion, combined with personal empowerment, to bring about meaningful, positive change. Gabriel's mother, two brothers, and three sisters have also become actively involved in the cause to bring safety and dignity to the many suffering in Darfur. Some of the campaigns initiated and/or led by Gabriel include the 100-Day Fast for Darfur, 100,000 postcards to legislators, Darfur Freedom Summer Vigils, Camp Darfur, and i-Act, among many other grassroots actions and presentations.
